About the project

Taylor Woodrow is the acting principal contractor for the Bridgwater Celebration Mile public realm project on behalf of our client Somerset Council. The project spans over Eastover, Clare Street and Angel Crescent, with works including underground utility maintenance (renewal and diversion), installation of new kerb lines, modernisation of paving, upgraded drainage systems and the installation of street furnishings and soft landscaping.

The project started in July 2024 in the Eastover area, our overall works are due to be completed between the next 12 -18 months, with estimated completion due in summer 2025.

Progress to date

April/May

Angel Crescent has been making great progress over the last few months, the
focus has been along the front of business entrances and the other side of
Angel Crescent throughout the under croft at the back of Angel Place
Shopping Centre, the work carried out has included excavating and laying
paving which has now completed by the team, The next stage is in progress
with the middle section of Angel Crescent for the final completion with the
team laying the final sets in the upcoming weeks allowing drainage to filter
through existing drainage, further work Landscaping and the installation of
street furnishings and soft landscaping.







- New Road On hold whilst critical work is carried out on Eastover.
- the kerb line positioned had to be reconsidered and re-designed due to a high & low voltage cable directly in the route along the original drawings. With the re-positioning of the kerb line now confirmed work is in full flow and in the process of being installed carefully along Eastover which includes widening the walkway on one side of Eastover. Pavement excavation has commenced on one side of the road along the front of businesses and residents' doors once completed along the north side of Eastover the work will switch to the south side in the same format due to commence early June. Works include National Grid & BT will be attending the site to remove and re-install link boxes in pavements before certain parts of the pavement can be excavated in the same process.



Traffic restrictions – what to expect

Live traffic restrictions

- One way traffic management in place for sections of Eastover including the indoor shopping centre to Salmon Parade. This is to allow our workforce to operate in a safe area whilst in the carriageway
- 22nd & Wed 23rd April Mount Street introduction of two-way temporary lights (two-way traffic) introducing off-peak two-way lights (9:30 – 16:00) to install temporary drop crossings. Existing signals will be switched off.
- 24th April onwards temporary two-way lights with two-way traffic
- 22nd April High Street to Clare Street pedestrian diversion (Please see below pedestrian management drawing)
- Includes the closure of the Clare Street access to 'The Avenue'
- 2nd June 31st July 2025 Church Street & Lower part of Eastover closure. A partial road closure on Church Street and the Eastern area of Eastover will commence from the 2nd of June 2025 for essential road works. These works will include the installation of new kerb lines and the resurfacing of pavements and are anticipated to be completed by the end of July 2025. A diversion route will be provided for residents of London Court with entry access available through the end of the bus route on Watsons Way.
